This abridged life table is constructed from the estimated populations and the total deaths registered during the years 1965-1967.

The column headed l_x shows the numbers who would survive to exact age x out of 10,000 born who were subject throughout their lives to the death probabilities indicated by the mortality records for the years 1965-1967.

Column e_x gives the "expectation of life"—that is the average future lifetime which would be lived by a person aged x if subject to those death probabilities.
